

## Addressing Priority Technical Issues for the Next Decade: Guiding Principles

- 1. While the long form provides a framework for comparison, the focus needs to be on the capacity of the ACS to meet data user needs.
- 2. How well the survey is meeting data needs for **small** administrative entities and population groups can only be truly assessed from **the perspective of the broad range of stakeholders** who use the data.
- 3. Tradeoffs will have to be made.


■ New and challenging environment for measuring change over time




